Welcome to the Shawano Lake County Park Campground! Reservation Rules & Policies

CAMPGROUND INFORMATION:

- Check-out time is 3 pm; check-in time is 4 pm
- Quiet time is 11 pm to 7 am.
- 1 camper & 1 tent per site, or 2 tents.
- 2 vehicles per campsite. \$5 fee for an extra vehicle at campsite.
- To reduce congestion in the campground, visitors must park in designated parking areas, not in campsites.
- Only one family or group (no more than 6 unrelated people) will be permitted on each site.
- Campers may not stay in the same site for more than 14 consecutive days.
- Permits may be revoked, and/or citations issued for any campers that violate any rules or regulations.
- Pets are allowed and must be kept quiet and leashed (not longer than 6') at all times. It is your responsibility to clean up after your pet.
- Pets may not enter bathing beach or playgrounds. We do have a separate dog beach.

PONTOONS/FISHING BOAT RENTALS:

- Hours: 8:00 am-7:00 pm (subject to change based on time of season, determined by Park Management)
- Each pontoon/boat comes with one tank of gas. Refills are available for an additional cost of \$25 per 5 gallons.
- Must be at least 21 years of age to rent and drive pontoons and fishing boats.
- Valid ID and credit/debit card are required and must be presented when registering.
- Renter must sign waiver prior to taking the pontoon/boat on water. Any damages will result in an additional charge.

CAMPING CANCELLATION POLICY:

- Cancellations made more than 3 days prior to arrival: loss of registration fee + \$10 cancellation fee.
- Cancellations made 1-3 days prior to arrival: loss of registration fee, 1 night camping + \$10 cancellation fee.
- No-shows or cancellations made on day of arrival: no refund.
- Pontoon/Fishing Boat: no refund unless severe or unsafe weather determined by park management.

The Shawano County Parks Department reserves the right to make adjustments, reject or cancel camping reservations when necessary to protect either campers or natural resources.
